MAWA Committee Nomination Form

Nomination forms must be received at the MAWA Office by the end of business, two days before the AGM.

Persons prohibited from nominating for MAWA Committee positions.

Under the 2015 Association Act, the following people will be prohibited from sitting on the Committee of MAWA (without prior approval by the Commissioner for Consumer Protection) if they:

- 1. are an undischarged bankrupt or their affairs are under insolvency laws;
- 2. have been convicted of an offence in connection with the promotion, formation or management of a body corporate;
- 3. have been convicted of an offence involving fraud or dishonesty punishable on conviction by at least three months or more imprisonment;
- have been convicted of an offence under Division 3 (the duties of officers provisions)
 or section 127 (the duty with respect to incurring of debt) of the Act.

Where a person is prohibited because they have been convicted of an offence, they cannot be a MAWA Committee member for a period of five years from their conviction, except where the conviction resulted in imprisonment, in which case they cannot be a MAWA Committee member for five years from their release from custody.
